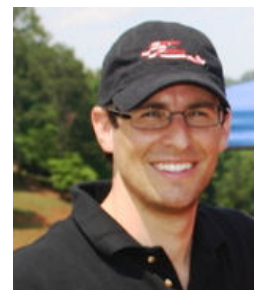


Mathew Pombo, M.D.

2003 –

- Began racing SCCA Spec Miata in Southeast Division with 2 wins, 2 second places and 1 4th place.

2004 -

- SCCA Spec Miata, with 4 wins and 2 second places.
- 3rd place in SARRC points.
- Second place in ARRC.

2005 -

- SCCA Spec Miata, with 6 wins.
- Second place in SARRC points.

2006 -

- Joined forces with Race Engineering in SCCA Spec Miata Nationals, won 6 races of 7 races. Southeastern Division Spec Miata Champion.
- July – The doctor for the Kyle Petty ride across America. Mathew will ride for some of the event when not needed for his medical abilities.

2007/2008

- Finished second in the 2007 SE National Championship points standings with one win and 5 podium finishes.
